

English Premier League: Run-In Analysis

European Places:

- **Champions League (Top 4):** Liverpool (76 pts), Arsenal (63), Nottingham (57), Newcastle (56) currently occupy the top four. Man City (55) and Chelsea (54) are close behind, so the race for the last two spots is tight and could go to the final weeks. Any slip-up could see teams drop out of the top four^[1].
- **Europa League (5th/6th):** Man City, Chelsea, and Aston Villa (54) are in contention. Only a few points separate these teams, so finishing strong is crucial^[1].
