

Brentford vs Everton

Match Summary

Brentford host Everton on April 11, 2026, in a tightly contested Premier League clash between the 7th and 8th placed teams. Both sides sit level on 46 points after 31 matches, battling for potential European qualification spots. Brentford will rely on their strong home record (26 goals scored, 17 conceded), despite an extensive injury list featuring Fábio Carvalho, Rico Henry, and Aaron Hickey. Everton arrive on the back of a statement 3-0 win against Chelsea but are hampered by the absence of marquee winger Jack Grealish, who is out with a foot injury, alongside left-back Vitaliy Mykolenko.

Reasoning: Both teams are evenly matched on 46 points. Brentford has drawn their last three matches, and the absence of critical playmakers for both sides (Carvalho for Brentford, Grealish for Everton) points toward a stalemate.

Under/Over 2.5 Goals - Under 2.5 Goals

Angle: Back Under 2.5 goals pre-match.

Reasoning: Everton possess a rigid away defense conceding only 1.07 goals per game, and their last few away results have been tight. With Grealish out, Everton's offensive output takes a hit, while Brentford's recent 0-0 draw suggests an attacking cooldown.
